Palliative care can be applied at the time of initial diagnosis of a disease process regardless of the pet's age and the disease prognosis.

Hospice on the other hand is palliative care medicine applied towards the end of life. As such hospice care also tends to require more intensive nursing from the pet's caregiver and higher nurturing support from the palliative care team.
